1. QWEST COMMUNICATIONS, N2001.5.64 (Dave)

On May 29, 2001, Qwest Communications filed Tariff Transmittal 01-15, “Digital Switched Services (DSS) Revisions.” The filing provides the following:

1. Provide an optional contact payment arrangement, rate stability plan, to customers who subscribe to Basic Digital Switched Services.
2. Modify terms and conditions removing restrictions on PBX trunks, Private line, Basic Exchange access lines, and Joint User from being allowed to ride on channels of DSS-DS1 facilities.

3. Introduce a 7-year Rate Stability Plan option for Advanced Service arrangements at existing 5-year RSP prices for trunks and at existing 7-year prices for the DS1 facility.
4. Extend ICB terms for 241 trunks to include DSS trunks.

2. Qwest Communications Docket N2001.5.69 (Scott)

On May 31, 2001 Qwest filed tariff Transmittal 01-16 to introduce a limited time promotion. Residence customers and Business customers who purchase Custom Choice or Two-Line Custom Choice during the promotional period will be mailed a coupon to verify their name and address. Once the resident customer returns the coupon, a \$20.00 rebate check will be mailed to the customer and a \$50.00 Visa Debit card will be mailed to the business customer. The customer must keep Custom Choice in service for 60 days before the check is mailed. This promotion is scheduled to run for residence customers from July 2, 2001 through August 11, 2001 and the business offering is from July 2, 2001 through August 24, 2001.

3. Qwest Communications Docket N2001.5.66 (Scott)

On May 29, 2001 Qwest filed tariff Transmittal 01-ACO4. In this filing Qwest is requesting to revise the switch access tariff Jurisdictional Reporting Requirements. The changes will be effective in the FCC Interstate tariffs on July 1, 2001 and is requested that the same effective date be on state tariffs. The filing removes the requirement currently placed on the carrier customer to report Percent Interstate usage (PIU) on a quarterly basis. In addition, the filing changes the basis for jurisdictional rating of FGD terminating minutes of use. This filing bases the rating on the actual jurisdiction determined by call record detail when available; when call detail is not available, the carrier reported PIU is used.

4. QWEST COMMUNICATIONS, INC. Docket N2001.5.65 (Leroy)

On May 29, 2001, Qwest Communications Inc filed tariff transmittal 01-AC03 "Introducing CCSAC Signaling Elements" to introduce five new elements in the Common Channel Signaling Access Capability (CCSAC) Section of the switched access tariff: ISUP Signal Formulation, ISUP and TCAP Signal Transport, and ISUP and TCAP Signal Switching. These elements currently exist in the FCC Interstate tariff and this filing brings state tariff rate elements in line with the interstate rate elements. The filing is revenue neutral to Qwest. The new CCSAC revenue is balanced through a decrease in other switched access rate elements.

5. QWEST COMMUNICATIONS N2001.6.68 (Dave)

On May 31, 2001, Qwest Communications filed Tariff Transmittal 01-17, "Introduce Complete-a-Call." This optional feature, "Complete-a-Call", will be available when customers call directory assistance. "Complete-a-Call" allows the customer to request the completion of the call to the requested number by the directory assistance operator or by the audio response system. The rate for the call completion transaction is \$.35. This feature is currently an offering by many other directory assistance vendors.
