

COMES NOW, U S WEST Communications, Inc. (U S WEST), and respectfully moves the
the Montana Public Service Commission (Commission) for entry of a protective order pursuant
to the provisions of Mont. Code Ann. § 69-3-105(2). U S WEST integrates into its motion its
brief in support of the motion.

INTRODUCTION

This matter relates to the filing by U S WEST of its Annual Report to the Commission for the year 1998. Three of the schedules of information which U S WEST has been requested to provide to the Commission contain information which is either closely held by U S WEST as confidential business information or as information about its employees for which they have a legitimate expectation of privacy. The Schedules are:

CENTRAL OFFICE - ACCESS LINE STATISTICS	SCHEDULE 23
CENTRAL OFFICE - SWITCH INFORMATION	SCHEDULE 24(f)
COMPENSATION OF TOP 10 MONTANA BASED EMPLOYEES	SCHEDULE 27

U S WEST requests the issuance of a protective order so that the information requested by the Commission may be provided to it while being protected against public disclosure.

U S WEST IS ENTITLED TO ISSUANCE OF THE REQUESTED PROTECTIVE ORDER

Mont. Code Ann. § 69-3-105(2) provides that the Commission may issue a protective order to preserve the confidentiality of a trade secret as defined in Mont. Code Ann. § 30-14-402.¹ Mont. Code Ann. § 30-14-402(4) provides in pertinent part:

¹Section 69-3-105(2) is a partial codification of the holding in *Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company v. Department of Public Service Regulation*, 194 Mont. 630, 634 P.2d 181 (1981). That case held that the Commission is constitutionally required to preserve the confidentiality of trade secrets, independent of its enabling legislation.

(4) "Trade secret" means information . . . that:

- (a) derives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use; and
- (b) is the subject of efforts that are reasonable under circumstances to maintain its secrecy.

Although § 69-3-105(2) does not specifically mention issuing a protective order to protect a utility employee's right of privacy, which is protected under Section 10 of Article II of the Montana Constitution, it is clear that a protective order should issue, at the request of a utility, to protect such rights, *State v. Burns*, 253 Mont. 37, 830 P.2d 1318 (1992); *Montana Human Rights Division v. Billings*, 199 Mont. 434, 649 P.2d 1283 (1982).

Schedules 23 and 24(f) report detailed information about the U S WEST customer base, indicating customer counts (access lines) and characteristics (residential, commercial, single line, etc.), or its switching facilities. Prior to the enactment of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 (Act), U S WEST did not consider or treat such information as confidential business information because of its position as the monopoly provider of local exchange service. However, since the Act, that information has become confidential business information as its public disclosure would allow U S WEST competitors in the local exchange market to target their investment and offerings to the areas in Montana which the information in the schedules establishes as having high customer concentrations or growth rates. Although this information was publicly reported prior to the Act, customer growth and changes in concentration cannot be detected if it is not publicly reported in the future. U S WEST no longer reports this information in a public manner so that it can protect it as confidential trade secret information. The kind of information reported in Schedules 23 and 24(f) is not the kind of information which companies share in a competitive market environment. The Commission determined in Order 6080 entered in Docket N 98.6.148 that the information in these schedules should be protected.

Schedule 27 reports the salaries of the ten highest paid U S WEST employees in Montana. Those employees have a legitimate expectation that their salary information be kept private, an

expectation which this Commission has routinely met through the issuance of a protective order. The Commission determined in Order 6080a entered in Docket N 98.6.148 that this information should be protected.

U S WEST requests the issuance of a protective order in the manner and form annexed to this motion as **Appendix A**.

On July 2, 1999, **U S WEST Communications, Inc. (U S WEST)** filed its Motion for Protective Order with the **Montana Public Service Commission (Commission)**.

The Commission considers it appropriate to issue a Protective Order to provide a procedure for balancing the public's right to know against U S WEST's right to non-disclosure of proprietary and confidential information, and information about its employees in which they have legitimate expectation of privacy. This Order affords interested parties an opportunity to challenge the proprietary or confidential designation. In issuing this Order, the Commission is not deciding or expressing any opinion as to whether the subject information is or is not proprietary or confidential information under Montana law.

Based upon the foregoing, the following Protective Order shall be in effect with respect to information contained in the U S WEST Annual Report of 1998.

1. **Confidential Information.** The information set forth in Schedules 23 and 24(f) of the U S WEST Annual Report for 1998 will be kept confidential and not publicly disclosed because of the claim of U S WEST that it contains proprietary data entitled to protection as a trade secret. The information set forth in Schedule 27 of the Annual Report for 1998 will be kept confidential and not publicly disclosed because of the legitimate expectation of U S WEST employees that their salary information be kept private.

2. **Terms of Disclosure.** The information contained in Schedules 23, 24(f), and 27 will not be disclosed to the public in any fashion, directly or indirectly. It will be kept confidential by the Commission, and disclosed to no one, except as may be provided by further order of the Commission, and upon adequate notice to U S WEST. The **Montana Consumer Counsel (MCC)** may apply to the Commission for permission to review the information, provided an adequate non-disclosure agreement is provided by that office to U S WEST.

3. **Challenge to Confidentiality.** This Order shall not be construed as a final ruling on the confidentiality of the information contained in Schedules 23, 24(f) and 27. An interested person or entity with proper standing, or the Commission on its own motion, may challenge the U S WEST claim of confidentiality at any time. Any such petition or motion must be served upon U S WEST, and it may file a response or objection within fourteen days thereafter. U S WEST may also request a hearing or oral argument before the Commission.

4. **Seal.** While in custody of the PSC and MCC, materials subject to this Order shall be marked, "CONFIDENTIAL -- SUBJECT TO PROTECTIVE ORDER" and due to their private nature they shall not be considered as records in the possession or retained by the PSC or MCC within the meaning of the open meetings or public records statutes.

5. The PSC and its counsel staff, and the MCC and its counsel and staff, shall be bound by the terms of this Order.

6. **Segregation of Files.** All proprietary information filed with the Commission will be sealed by the Commission, segregated in the files of the Commission, and withheld from inspection by any person not bound by the terms of this Order, unless such proprietary information is released from the restrictions of this Order either through agreement of the parties, an order of the Commission or an order of a Court having jurisdiction. All written proprietary information coming into the possession of the MCC under this Order may be retained by him in

his office files, but shall be withheld from inspection by others, except for his staff and his counsel, unless released by agreement or order of the Commission.

7. **Amendment or Modification.** The Commission retains jurisdiction of this matter and may alter or amend these provisions, upon motion by an appropriate party or entity and reasonable notice.

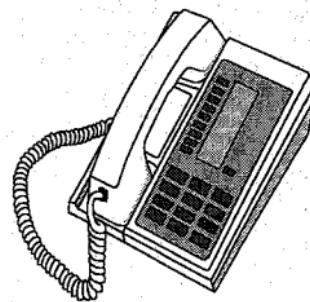
